

Information About Data Collection in Professor John Lande's Presentations

As part of today's program, Professor John Lande will ask about your experiences, practices, and beliefs about lawyering and mediation. This is part of the "Stone Soup Dispute Resolution Knowledge Project," which is designed to promote collaboration by faculty, students, scholars, practitioners, educational institutions, and professional associations to produce, disseminate, and use valuable qualitative data about actual dispute resolution practice.
